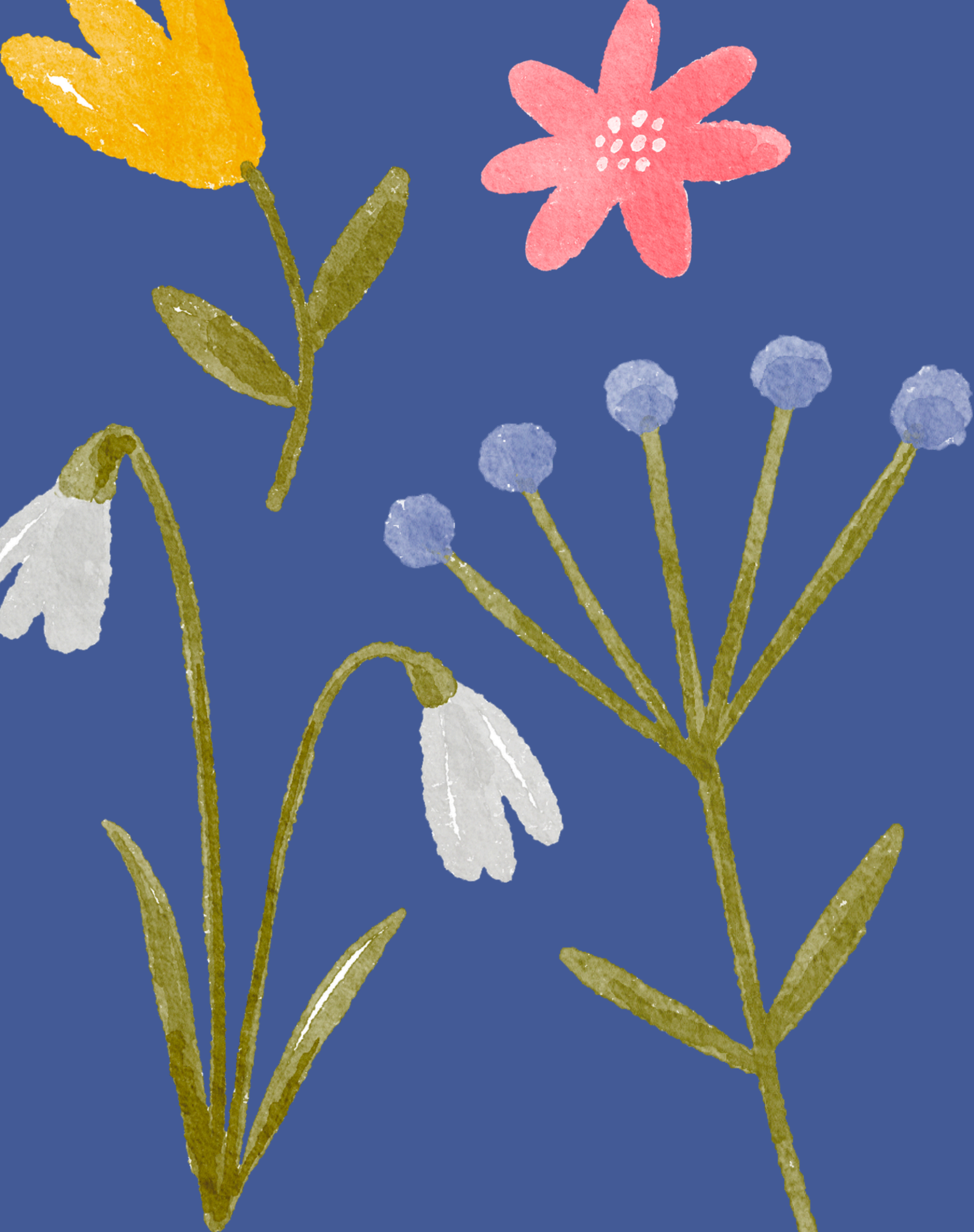


WHAT IS EASTER?

Easter is a Christian holiday that celebrates the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Christians believe that Jesus died and came back to life, bringing hope and new beginnings.

People celebrate Easter in many ways. Christians go to church and spend time with family. Children love Easter egg hunts, where they search for hidden eggs filled with candy or toys.

Some places have Easter parades, where people wear colorful clothes and march through the streets. Families also enjoy a special Easter meal, and kids often receive Easter baskets filled with chocolate and sweets.

EASTER AROUND THE WORLD

Different countries celebrate Easter in unique ways. In the United States and the UK, kids hunt for **Easter eggs** and eat **chocolate bunnies**.

In Spain, people have **big parades** during Semana Santa (Holy Week).

In Italy, families enjoy **special meals**, and in Germany, people decorate trees with hanging Easter eggs. In Australia, instead of the Easter Bunny, they have the **Easter Bilby**, an animal that helps raise awareness about endangered species.





FUN FACTS ABOUT EASTER

Did you know that Easter is one of the biggest holidays for candy sales? Every year, over 90 million chocolate bunnies are made! The world's biggest chocolate Easter egg weighed over 7,000 kg.

The White House in the USA hosts an Easter Egg Roll, where kids roll eggs across the grass. The first chocolate eggs were made in France and Germany over 200 years ago!
